John Roshan, MD, DM[Card], CCDS, CEPS is a Professor in the Cardiology Department at Christian Medical College Vellore. He did his undergraduate and postgraduate training at the same institution during which he was the recipient of several awards that included the AV Gandhi prize for excellence in Cardiology. He had his initial cardiac electrophysiology training under Dr. Tom Peter Professor Emeritus University of



California, Los Angeles.
